Science can and should contribute to solving many global challenges our society faces, such as climate change, health, pollution and resource depletion. With that aim in mind, the European Commission (EC) recently pushed forward the concept of Responsible Research and Innovation (RRI) to foster and facilitate research and innovation in an inclusive, societally oriented way.

The goal of RRI Tools project funded by EC, is to emphasize the importance of societal issues in science and innovation and to empower collaboration between different groups of stakeholders in research and innovation process (e.g. scientists, science educators and policy makers).

Before encouraging the collaboration, the dialogue between science community and general public needs to be improved. In order to do that we should go back to school where teaching and learning scientific literacy begins.

The European project "RRI Tools" has been set up in order to empower all actors to contribute their share to a Responsible Research and Innovation (RRI), built with and for society. Significant opportunities for businesses and scientists could come from Responsible Research and Innovation, according to the findings of a series of different events organized by "RRI Tools" in 30 European countries, gathering participants from 5 stakeholder groups - researchers, business and industry, policy-makers, civil society organizations and education community.

RRI Tools is a project funded for three years (2014-2016) by the European Commission under the 7<sup>th</sup> Framework Programme (FP7). The main objective of RRI Tools is a participatory set of digital resources – the RRI Toolkit.
